

# ENGLISH - CREATIVE WRITING CONCENTRATION (B.A.)

The Creative Writing Concentration requires 12 credits in Creative Writing coursework. These credits count toward the 36 credits required for the English major.

120 credits of coursework is required for the baccalaureate degree with a minimum 2.0 overall GPA, and a minimum 2.0 major GPA.
